1. Town of Abergavenny. At the first meeting of the Commissioners##
2. named in an Act passed in the present session of parliament intituled "An
3. "Act for paving and otherwise Improving the Town of Abergavenny, and the
4. "limits thereof, in the County of Monmouth" held at the Greyhound Inn in the
5. said Town of Abergavenny on Wednesday the second day of July in the year
6. of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and ninety four between the Hours
7. of ten and twelve in the forenoon of the same day pursuant to the directions
8. of the said Act and in order to carry the same into Execution (John Hanbury
9. Williams Esquire in the Chair).

10. Resolved that M^r. Baker Gabb be appointed Clerk to the Commissioners
11. for carrying this Act into Execution, and that the quantum of his Salary be
12. settled at some subsequent Meeting.

13. Resolved that M^{ssrs}. Hill, Kinsey and company, Bankers in Abergavenny,
14. be appointed Treasurer to the said Commissioners.

15. Resolved that Thomas Williams be appointed Messenger to the said
16. Commissioners, with a Salary of Five pounds per Annum.

17. Resolved that the thanks of the Inhabitants of the Town of
18. Abergavenny and the Commissioners named in the above Act be given
19. to his Grace the Duke of Beaufort, the Marquis of Worcester and Robert
20. Salisbury Esquire for their kind and obliging support in obtaining the
21. above Act and that the same be transmitted to them in letters signed
22. by the Chairman.

23. Resolved that the like thanks be given to William Jones of Clytha
24. Esquire, William Dinwoody Esquire and George Robinson Esquire for their
25. very friendly assistance in obtaining the above Act.

This Meeting stands adjourned to the Greyhound Inn above said
to Saturday the fifth day of July Instant at ten o'clock in the

13. William Warner and on the scite of the Grounds to be so purchased shall be
14. erected Butchers' Shops, Shops, Sheds, Stalls and Shambles, Standings and
15. other conveniences as shall be judged proper according to a plan and estimate
16. to be delivered by Mr. Nash.

17. Resolved that Mr. Nash do forthwith make a Survey and Estimate of the
18. expenses of laying down Iron or other pipes in lieu of the present Lead pipes –
19. stating the value of the old Lead pipes – also a separate estimate of a new pond
20. Head in case the same should be necessary – also a plan and estimate of
21. Pitching and Flagging the principal Streets of the Town, keeping the
22. estimate of each Street separate in order to judge which of them it may be
23. expedient to pave.

at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to be then held at the Greyhound Inn,
in Abergavenny.

17. each pig or swine with the expence of impounding shall be paid.

18. Ordered that the Clerk prepare extracts from the said Act relative to
19. several Offences created thereby and that such extracts be laid before the
20. Commissioners at their next meeting.

23. Two thousand two hundred and fifty pounds – Resolved that it be taken
24. into Consideration, at the next Meeting, the propriety of such subscribers paying
25. into the Hands of the Treasurers a deposit of five per Cent on their subscription

26. Ordered that Nicholas Yarnold, Plumber, do examine the Pound head
27. and the several Pipes leading therefrom in such places which appear defective
